From Our Pastor

Have you ever listened to yourself pray? Have you ever stopped to consider your motives when you pray? Do our prayers really make sense? Are our prayers about us instead of Him? What are we really praying for? Do we pray to be heard of man or to be heard of God? These are legitimate questions that need to be asked as we pray. Next time you pray take time to listen to what you are saying to God. Are we making an impression upon God?

An author who needed money, wired his publisher and asked, "How much advance will you pay for my latest novel of fifty thousand words?" The publisher wired back, "How important are the words?" What are our words worth when it comes to talking to God? Is there truly worth in our words? How important are our words?

The scripture says in James 4:3, "Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts." Our prayers should be for the extension of God's Kingdom and for Him to be glorified. So many times we pray with selfish motives and then we wonder why God does not answer our prayers.

In Luke 12:13-15, a man was asking Jesus to speak to his brother about dividing their family inheritance. His intent was legitimate but his motive was selfish. He desired more to receive his money than for God to be glorified. Jesus did not answer his request because he was asking amiss. Jesus rebuked him in verse 15 when he said, "Take heed, and beware of covetousness: for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth." Lehman Strauss once stated, "The true purpose of prayer is not to obtain the things we want from God but rather to make us content with the things He wants us to have."

The best thing to do when we pray is to release the results to God and make sure that our intent is for God to be glorified no matter which way He chooses to answer. It does not mean that I cannot ask but it does mean that I want God's favor in my prayer life more than I want my own way. Prayer is not me bargaining with God trying to get something out of Him that is not in His heart to give me, but rather it is me yielding to the Spirit of God, and asking the Holy Spirit to give me wisdom in prayer.

For me evaluation is the key. Just taking the time to listen to what I am saying and making sure I speak from a heart that "wants God's will done on earth."



The Price of Procrastination

Have you ever driven through town and seen things that have caused you to say: "We really should do something to help that woman, it must be tough taking care of that many children." Or wondered: "Where does that man sleep at night?" Have you driven down a backroad in your neighborhood and thought: "That house really needs paint, I guess they just couldn't afford it this year, maybe next summer we can give them a hand." Too often we stop with those well meaning thoughts and never follow through with actions that will actually improve the situation or make people's lives better.

There are always going to be reasons that we put off things that we had fully intended to do. Our plans to paint the back bedroom or organize the pantry may be interrupted when a friend stops by for coffee. Then we tell ourselves that the day is almost done anyway, and we'll get to it first thing tomorrow. Of course the next day something else comes up, and the cycle repeats until it is the end of the week and the job still hasn't been begun.

We struggle with too many tasks and too little time in our personal lives, and we struggle with overwhelming community needs and too few willing hands to minister to them in our church life. Too often we are like the men in Luke 9: 57-62 who responded to a call to follow Jesus with things that they needed to do before they could begin. Think of all the chances that we lose to minister to others and to advance our Father's kingdom with the thought, I'll get to it tomorrow.

Consider the ideas that were mentioned in church, those that sounded promising in the beginning, but fizzled out before they were completed. Look around your neighborhood and consider the needs that you see all around you. The price we pay for our procrastination is high.

Now imagine our community if we followed through on those fleeting impulses to do good for our fellow man. What would it look like if we phoned that friend who missed church? If we visited the sick and the lonely? Helped out those who were in need of support and comfort? It's a very different picture isn't it?

As we look around our world today there are so many people lost. So many people hurting. So many in need. It can seem over whelming, but remember you are not working alone! Philippians 4:13 tells us that we can do all things through Christ, who gives us strength. But for God to use us mightily, we first have to be willing to take that first step. We have to stop saying: "I'll get to it tomorrow."




COME JOIN US IN SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR A BLESSING THIS WEEK!






YOUTH SUNDAY!!!


WinterJam Fun!
