The "incarnation" of Christ is a great mystery to many but it is the core of the Christmas message. It is difficult for the natural mind to grasp this deep truth. I can understand man being made in the image of God but why in the world would God want to be made in the image of man? The word "incarnation" literally means the act of assuming flesh, whereby the Son of God voluntarily assumed a human body and nature. One gentleman wrote it this way, "God did not send Christ to us; God came to us in Christ." John 1:14 says, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."

The astronaut, James Erwin who traveled to the moon, experienced things that you and I never will experience. He never got over the truth concerning Christmas. His words were, "There's something more important than man walking on the moon, and that is God, walking on the earth." There are many ways that God could have chosen to communicate to man but this was His way of choosing. Philippians 2:6-8 says, "Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross."

- Christ had a human birth This was God contracting to the size of a woman's womb. Jesus is fully human and fully divine. He is fully human because He came from Mary's womb but He is also fully divine because he was conceived by the Holy Spirit. He is not half-human and half-divine. He is the God-man, one person possessing two natures, God incarnate in human flesh.
- Christ had human development.
- Christ has the essential elements of a human nature a personality, a disposition, an attitude.
- Christ had human names Jesus, Son of David, Son of Man.
- Christ had the sinless infirmities of humanity He hungered, he needed rest, he was tempted.
- Christ was repeatedly referred to as a man.

Jesus did not just come to *hang* with humans. He came because He was on a mission. God looked down from heaven and saw the predicament of man and the devastation of sin and his heart was moved. Because of His great love for mankind he created a plan that would *take the life of His Son in order to create life for many sons*. The Bible says in Isaiah 7:14, "Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." Matthew 1:21, 23 states, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

The incarnation was the means by which God used "our extremity as an opportunity to do something supernatural." The Bible says in John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." Thank God for His unspeakable gift of eternal life!




