OUR CHURCH'S FUTURE SUCCESS DEPENDS UPON PRAYER

Happy New Year! When I think about what the Lord did last year—great events and speakers, wonderful messages from our pastor, constant protection, the love experienced, people saved, and countless lives changed through Hollywood Baptist Church—I really am grateful. He's too kind to us!

But, we have to face it. So much of the past success at Hollywood Baptist Church has surfed on the wave of the Lord's specific responses to prayer. God's people at Hollywood Baptist Church have prayed, and God has responded here in monumental ways. And just because we have prayed in the past doesn't mean we will in the future. I believe our church will fall apart at the seams ... if we stop praying.

I also believe that most people don't pray very much. And when they do, they don't pray effectively. Sometimes it's because we don't know how. But too often it's random, proud, general, irreverent demands coming from selfish, unclean hearts that don't really believe God cares or will answer.

Prayer is also hard work. It's easier to go out and attempt to fix things ourselves than to pray about them. Sincere prayer is difficult to do in the flesh because it's not glamorous and requires us to be still, quiet, humble, and honest before a sovereign and holy God. That can be amazingly fulfilling or totally uncomfortable depending upon your level of surrender. It's also easy to put off prayer in our busyness until later and save it as an emergency parachute for times of crisis. I've done that too many times.

It doesn't have to be that way. Prayer is too wonderful and important! It's a big deal to God and should be to us. I think of those "back to the basics" moments in Scripture. When Jesus cleansed the temple, what did He say? He proclaimed, "My house will be called a house of prayer" (Matt. 21:13). Thus, Jesus distilled the purpose of God's house down to the practice of people getting together to pray.

Why so much emphasis on prayer? Because it's like oxygen to the Christian life. It's the wind in the sails propelling all our ministries. It's our accessing God's kingdom power and provision for all of life. Prayer lines up our hearts and minds with His heart and mind.

I am therefore burdened and praying for our future prayer effectiveness at Hollywood Baptist Church. As the leader of the Prayer Ministry, I'm praying for God to raise up more Prayer Warriors who dare to see God's sovereignty as bigger than any storm or problem. I'm asking for those who are willing to humbly ask for huge things in faith believing God can and will act. I want us to go on a journey and learn how to pray and then do it constantly and effectively. We can learn to boldly approach the throne of grace together for mercy and help in time of need. I'm daring you to join the adventure. Will you?

Over the month of January, you will be given an opportunity to commit yourself to becoming a Hollywood Baptist Church Prayer Warrior this next year. Pray about it. We want you and your family to join in. We need you this year to help us make a difference through prayer. You will be closer to God, more at rest, and more like Christ if you become a person of prayer. Whatever it is God has in store for Hollywood Baptist Church, it will require us to pray big, bold, and daring prayers together as a unified church family.


2015 Lottie Moon Offering

Answered Prayers

In keeping with the focus that we are placing on the power of prayer here at Hollywood in this New Year, I want to share a story about how one of my prayers was answered with you. Several years ago I made a new friend and though I hadn't known her long, she was rapidly becoming an important part of my life. We were both relatively young, neither of us even thirty yet, and I was newly returned to church and a relationship with God after a long absence on my part. So you can imagine how disturbed I was one night to wake from a vivid dream of being at her funeral. This dream didn't include how she'd died, so there was nothing that I could warn her against. Humans are very vulnerable, fragile creatures, and the threat to her could have come from any number of places.

No date or time frame was given in the dream either, though I felt that the danger was near. There was nothing that I could do, no warning or protection I could offer. So I prayed. I prayed for God to protect my friend, and if it was his will to keep her safe. I asked that if it wasn't his will to save her to help me and the others who would grieve her loss, for she is well loved by many and would be greatly missed. I felt a sense of calm and comfort wash over me, and went back to sleep. By morning the horror of the dream had somewhat faded, though it was still of course on my mind.

Over the course of the day the feeling faded somewhat, but that afternoon I received news. My friend had been in a car accident. Her car had slid on a patch of spilled oil on the highway, spun across several lanes of traffic, and hit the cement road divider. Her car was totaled, and she was understandably shaken and sore. But she was alive. I found out later that one of the officers at the scene told her that she'd missed death by only inches, and that the man who hit the patch of oil behind had been taken from the scene in critical condition.

I will always believe that God protected my friend that day, that he moved me to pray for her, and that he answered my prayer and gave her car that tiny nudge it needed to have shifted those few inches to keep her from harm. I believe that this is the power of intercessionary prayer, and that our Heavenly Father listens when we ask for protection and care for others. It is for this reason that I encourage you, when you feel the need to pray for someone, do so without delay or hesitation.

The same friend is now facing cancer and while I still grieve to see her suffer, my prior experience gives me comfort. It helps me trust and believe that God will use this horrific experience for her good, and that all those prayers being sent up in her behalf will be answered. It helps me believe that God has a wondrous plan for her and her life. And it helps me remember to pray for her comfort and safety frequently.

Not all prayers are answered in such a dramatic fashion. Far too often we pray for things, but do not receive immediate answers, and by the time that our prayers have been answered we may have forgotten that we have even asked God to help us. And even when we remember, it is far too easy to forget to acknowledge and be thankful for the actions that God has taken on our behalf. In an attempt to rectify this, in future issues of the newsletter I would like to include examples of answered prayers great and small, so that we are all reminded that our God answers those who call on his name.
