### From Our Pastor

2020, what a year to remember!!! This one will go down in the history books. For some it has been the worst year they have ever encountered. The scars and wounds will linger for many years to come and the hurt and pain will be lodged in their memory banks for a long time.

The struggle that I have had is to look for and find the good in all of it. As I have pondered in my heart to try to find the good in the events of this past year, I had to be willing to admit that first, I have learned some flexibility. How many of us had to learn to do things a different way while we trusted for the same results? We had to make the adjustments to do things differently to carry out our responsibilities. Who would have thought that we would be forced to move our church services to the church parking lot? Who would have thought that we would not be able to get within 6 feet of each other and our pews would be marked off by painters' tape in order to practice social distancing? What is social distancing we would ask? Who would have thought that masks would become a part of our regular church attire?

We were forced to put into motion things that we had talked about for several years. The leadership had discussed for a while about the importance of making our services available on Live Stream. Because of the pandemic, we were pushed to moving on this and by doing so, we immediately enlarged our base as far people viewing the services. This means that the gospel is going out in many different directions and people are being challenged to be saved on a larger scale.

Also, we had discussed taking advantage of the online giving services that would open an opportunity for our people to give online. We were able to accomplish this several months into the pandemic and our monies have increased by implementing this service. Both of these adjustments are proving to be an asset to our ongoing ministry.

The second thing that I have had to learn to do during this pandemic is to trust God to minister to our people in their times of suffering. It has been extremely hard not to be involved as closely as I would like to when it comes to our people and their adversities. Some of our people have walked through some "gut wrenching" situations concerning themselves and their family members. Deaths, sicknesses, quarantines, isolation accompanied by a deep sense of loss and pain. As a Pastor you feel the need to minister but you are so limited as to what you can do outside of praying for them and using the limited forms of communication that are available. It is one thing to trust God for paper towels and toilet paper, but it is another to trust God to minister to that hurting heart as they try to converse with their loved one through a dirty window. Or not being able to be with them at all when they take their last breath.


