From Our Associate Pastor of Youth and Music

I had the opportunity to go kayaking and camping with my two oldest sons last week. It was quite an experience. I was so sore after 39 miles of kayaking. I slept fitfully at best, spending one night on hard-pack dirt and the other on gravel, both sites without a ground pad. I got rocks in my sandals every time I stepped out of the kayak. The sun was incredibly hot, but the water was ice cold. I even got more up-close and personal with a 200 pound black bear than I would have liked. And it was glorious.

My description of the trip certainly doesn't match the final assessment. Unless you are an ardent camper or out-doorsman, nothing about that description sounds "glorious." So, you might ask, why would I describe my trip this way? It's all about perspective.

My sons and I have done a lot of camping. We have been on trips where it rained the entire time. We have been on trips where the high was in the low 20s. We have slept under tarps and in debris huts (shelters made out of whatever you can find in the immediate area). We even went on one trip where we slept in a debris hut in the pouring rain and the nighttime low was in the high teens.

For our most recent trip, it did not rain a drop. The temperatures during the day and at night were ideal for being out-doors. We were able to bring good quality equipment to make us more comfortable. The blessings of God's beautiful creation were evident all around us. It was...glorious.

James writes: "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." James 1:2-4, ESV

I appreciated our most recent camping trip more because of the difficult trips that lay in my past. When something did not go quite right or quite how I would have liked I drew on the memory of prior greater difficulties and hardships for encouragement. Our faith walk is the same.

No one who is sane rejoices in the midst of their trials. However, we live in a fallen, sinful world, and trials will come. They will overwhelm us, discourage us, and drive us to throw in the towel. But James says we need to look past the moments of trial and rejoice because of the steadfastness, or faithful steadiness, that they produce.

Much like arduous camping experiences drive us to appreciate the glorious ones, trials in our life help us to appreciate the times of comfort and peace. Much like learning how to endure terrible environmental conditions makes it easier to enjoy slightly imperfect weather and situations, enduring trials through faith strengthens our faith so that the next time a trial comes along, we are more spiritually prepared.

Someone once said that every believer is in one of three seasons; we are either going through a trial, just completing a trial, or get ready to experience a trial. Some of us have constant trials that run in the background while we experience those three situations. And James says to "count it all joy."

When our faith is tested we have two options: quit or lean on our faith. When we lean on our faith, it only gets stronger. When the next trial comes, we are more prepared to deal with it because of past experience. We become "steadfast" in our faith, ready to endure whatever this sinful world throws at us. And the more steadfast we become, the more "perfect and complete" we are.

Let each of us commit to rejoice, not for the trial itself, but for the strength and faith it produces. Look toward that day when all trials will be ended, and "our faith will be made sight."
