November 28 for \$109. Never been to an advance? A discount is available if you'd like to give it a try!





Read that verse again. It doesn't say Rejoice ABOUT EVERYTHING. What it says is Rejoice IN THE LORD ...

not my circumstances. My joy comes from Jesus who is always faithful & can always be trusted. Whether He changes the circumstances or not, He will change my heart and flood me with His peace. No matter what my life looks like, no matter what circumstances I am in, God will ALWAYS, ALWAYS, ALWAYS be worthy of my rejoicing and praise.

Giving thanks to God in all things is bowing to His sovereignty. Rejoicing in Him is a celebration of it. Our true joy is found solely in the Lord. Not in the people in our lives, not our situations, not what we have or don't have, not how we feel, but completely and totally in Him.
