An Update From Jared

Our trip to Argentina was an extraordinary experience, one that has left a lasting impact on the Knoxville Fellows. From the moment we arrived in Buenos Aires, the capital of Argentina, we were deeply immersed in the culture and the vibrant energy of the city. We had the privilege of visiting significant landmarks, including the presidential residence, and exploring both open and closed markets, where we had the chance to taste local foods and engage with the community.

In addition to our cultural exploration, we were fortunate to collaborate with a local organization dedicated to helping individuals transitioning out of prison and those recovering from trafficking. On Sunday, we attended a church service that was attended by people from various nations, including Brazil, Paraguay, Africa, and the United States. The warmth, hospitality, and genuine love extended to us by the congregation were overwhelming. We were embraced not only as volunteers but as part of their family.

Following our time in Buenos Aires, we traveled to Matheu, a province located outside the capital. The area we stayed in was isolated, with many surrounding homes reported to be associated with much drug activity. One of the highlights of our stay was working with Vos Tambien, an organization dedicated to transforming a property they had purchased. The goal was to create a space for women who had escaped trafficking and their children. Our tasks ranged from building a classroom and constructing protective walls to painting and clearing the land. We also had the opportunity to work alongside the women who had benefited from the organization's efforts, forging deep and meaningful connections that made the work even more significant.

What was truly inspiring was seeing the generosity and resilience of the people we encountered, who had so little yet gave so much. They taught us invaluable lessons about faith, hope, and the strength of community. Even when sickness affected our group, the locals selflessly gave up their beds, food, and time to care for us, leaving us with a profound sense of gratitude. I felt that I received just as much as I gave, if not more.

The cultural exchange during this trip was equally eye-opening. I gained a deeper understanding of the diverse traditions, languages, and lifestyles that shape our world. It was a powerful reminder of both our shared humanity and the unique qualities that make each culture special.

Ultimately, this journey was not only about completing meaningful work but about building relationships, broadening our perspectives, and experiencing the profound impact of giving without expecting anything in return. It was an unforgettable journey of personal growth, connection, and service. I am deeply grateful for this trip and have much thanks to give Hollywood Baptist. You guys helped provide, not only myself, but our group of 18, with the opportunity to go and experience this. Vos Tambien has had such a profound effect on my own heart. When I say our cups have been filled, they are truly running over. Our Lord's hand is at work everywhere, and what a blessing it is to get to be a part of it. Thank you all, greatly!

2025 Lottie Moon Offering

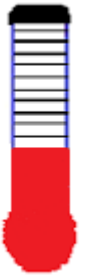
In 2024 we raised **\$31,988.43** for Lottie Moon offering.

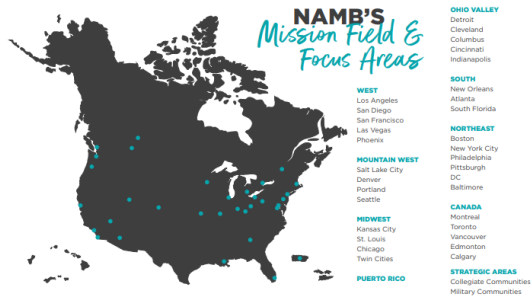
